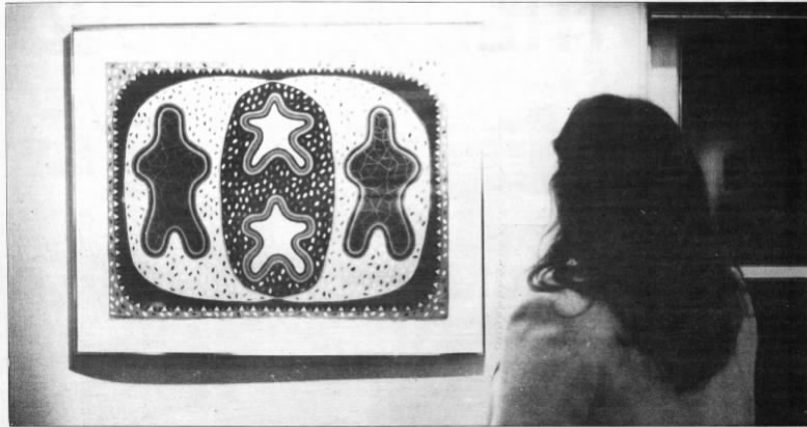

The Eccles Community Art Center presents "From the Feminine Eye," an exhibit of artworks from a group of 12 Utah women artists.

Kaye Treseder Terry, who earned a bachelor of science degree

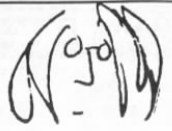
in design from the University of Utah, enjoys ancient Greek history. She explores her ideas in her artwork through Greek landscape, significant sites and personal memories, and art history.
