Arts pageant invites Utahns to 'share the wonder'

The magic of the Utah Pageant of the Arts is back, and Utahns are invited to come share the wonder as the "live picture" production enters its 17th season.



This year, some of the Pageant's best work and audience favorites will be featured, accompanied by narration each Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Monday, evening from 7 to 9 p.m. at American Fork High School.

Under the direction of David O. Brockbank, the show will feature including the "Walking Liberty Gold Piece," "Window Illusion," "The Whip," and many others including painting, sculpture, and photography. The popular "Mystic Angel," by Lucie Cartwright, will also be reproduced for reproduction.

Three volunteer casts of 45 each will rotate during the Pageant's six-week run. In addition to the stage production, a ticket-admission program for live art exhibits by Utah students and professional artists.

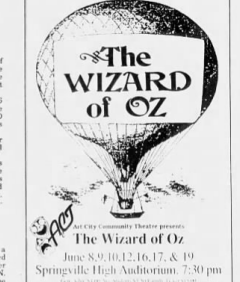
Local Sheriff, Mayor appointed to Police Training Council
