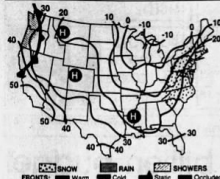

Weather



Utah: Partly cloudy through Thursday night with isolated showers over the mountains and gusty winds over the western valleys. Highs both days in the 40s; lows Thursday night from 25 to 35.

Northern Arizona and Nevada: Variable clouds and isolated afternoon showers over the mountains through Friday; breezy south which Thursday over the western valleys and becoming foggy Friday. Highs both days from the mid 40s through the 50s; lows Thursday night from 25 to 35.

Northern: Rain is forecast for parts of the Pacific Northwest. Snow is forecast for parts of the Ohio Valley and the southern to northern Atlantic coastal areas. Snow is possible in most of the northern coast.
