Associated Utah Artists exhibit

One of Utah's oldest professional art associations is the Associated Utah Artists. Founded in February of 1940 by Florence Wares, it counted among its charter members Ted Wasmann, Mary C. Kimball Johnson, LeClare Stewart, George Dunphy, Jack Wicks, Ken Davidson and Norma L. Birrell. James T. Harwood too was a charter member but died before their first show. Other important members through the years included Gordon Cope, B.F. Laraca, Cornelius Salisbury, Paul Salisbury and Alvin Gittens.

The association was founded with the idea of "painting sanely" in opposition to the hard abstraction of George Dibble and others. Florence Wares disliked the direction art was taking and vainly attempted to curb modernism's march to dominance. She believed, and rightly so, that eventually more of the official institutions of Utah would favor art of modernist tendencies.

The most interesting work in

the exhibition is a painted sculpture or a sculpted painting by Raymond Edgerton of a three-dimensional landscape. A recent Wares-esque "slide" by Marjorie Paxman and other bronze casts and marbles of older work by Alice Morrey Bailey are highlights of the exhibition.

The exhibition continues until September 1. The museum is closed on Mondays and is open between 10-5 Tues., Sat., Wed. until 9 p.m. and Sunday 3-6 p.m.
