The State Advertiser of Utah is offering some interesting winter workshops, classes and special events for the public according to Richard H. North, director.

The advertisement is a beautiful and informational piece to visit any time of year. You can visit Red Butte Gardens in the winter. They are open from dawn through February for daylight hours to guests on a first-come, first-served basis. Many strollers and dogs are not allowed in the gardens. For more information and seasonal checklists or other information, check with the director's office listed under the University of Utah, State Advertiser of Utah.

A special snowshoe outing will be directed by naturalist John LeComber. From this outing Feb. 4 from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. at the Snowshoe Outing Office. Cost is \$5 for paid members and \$8 for non-members.

Workshops on herbs will be given. Assistant Editor, Richard North, will conduct a class Feb. 25 from 9 a.m. to noon while Beverly Savage has a class March 4. Cost of

either class is \$7 for paid members and \$8 for non-members. For further information contact the advertisement office.

Becky Swindler, laboratory supervisor, Utah Museum of Natural History, will have a class on basket weaving with native plants March 11 from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. in the Den, Student Union. Cost is \$9 for paid members, \$12 for non-members. Bring eggs with natural plant dyes in a workshop by Anne Avery, Navajo weaver and dyer specialist. This is sponsored by Pioneer Trail State Park and will be in the park's social hall March 25 from 9 a.m. to noon. Cost is \$7 for paid members and \$8 for non-members.

From Jan. 4 to March 6, Mary Lou Rowley will conduct a class on herb training (classroom) Wednesdays from 6 to 10:15 p.m. in the James Linnage Building. Cost is \$89 non-refundable.

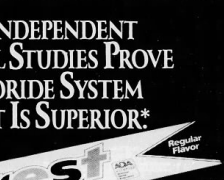
